### **Metro to share concepts for all-day bus service to Snoqualmie**

**Snoqualmie, WA** – According to King County Metro, the Snoqualmie Valley is poised to become the first area in the county to see a package of redesigned transit service concepts tailor-made to the needs of valley residents.

Metro began working with Snoqualmie Valley residents last fall to identify transportation options that are more cost effective and better meet the needs of residents and riders. Using feedback from previous community meetings and a rider survey, Metro has produced service concepts that will be the subject of continued community discussion at two upcoming meetings.

Metro's proposed concepts include adjustments that reflect the community's desire to see all-day service to Snoqualmie. Improved connections between Duvall and Redmond and a more reliable and better connected valley transit network were also high priorities. In addition to these service concepts, the plan points to the role vanpools and vanshares can play in providing additional transit opportunities

During the community meetings, Metro will provide an overview of the concepts and answer questions.
