Increased Utility Rates to Fund Utilities Improvements, Facilities, Equipment and Operations

Following a comprehensive utility rate study, the Snoqualmie City Council approved a graduated increase in rates for water, sewer, and storm water services for the years 2017-2020, as well as new connection charges for each utility. Revenue from the utility rates and connection charges will fund water and sewer main replacements; fire flow improvements; implementation of storm water programs and installation of drainage systems to meet new state requirements; improvements to the wastewater treatment facility; reconstruction and upgrades to lift stations; and 24/7 wastewater operations to protect water quality and public health, among other operational activities.

Residential and commercial rates are posted on the city website at bit.ly/SnoqUtilityRates. Low-income eligibility criteria and an application for reduced monthly water rates are also posted on the city website.

The cities of Snoqualmie and North Bend, along with Eastside Fire & Rescue, are jointly offering the FEMA-certified Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) course. Certified team members will be prepared to help their families and community during emergencies and disasters. The course includes four Saturday sessions on May 13, May 20, June 10, and June 17. All sessions are from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Snoqualmie Fire Station. The fee is \$25 per person, which is refundable upon completion of all sessions. Snoqualmie Firefighters Raise More than \$5K for Leukemia & Lymphoma Society

Nine Snoqualmie firefighters participated in the March 2017 Scott Firefighter Stair Climb at the Columbia Tower in Seattle, which benefited the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society. More than 2,000 regional firefighters in full gear climbed 69 floors. Lorrie Jones, Snoqualmie volunteer firefighter and team captain, said, "There is no better feeling than reaching the top, celebrating with other climbers from all over the area, and knowing the funds raised will help research and prevent blood cancers." Participating Snoqualmie firefighters raised \$5,162 in local donations.

Protect Your Pet and Other Animals from Abuse and Neglect

Is your pet licensed? It's inexpensive and easy to do. Licenses and renewals are available via the King County website and at Snoqualmie City Hall. Pet licensing has several benefits, for instance, lost pets with licenses can be quickly reunited with their owners through a free ride home provided by the Kent Animal Shelter. License fees also support services for other animals such as investigation of animal neglect or cruelty and spay/neuter programs to reduce pet over-population. General fees are only \$15 for pets under 6 months old and only \$30 for those older than 6 months that have been spayed or neutered. Some owners are eligible for discount licenses.
