Storm and Flood Resources Posted on City Website

Snoqualmie, WA – With the rainy season in full force and winter temperatures on their way, the City of Snoqualmie Emergency Management Department would like to bring attention to the flood and storm resources page on the city website. Go to www.cityofsnoqualmie.org, locate the “How do I find” box and click “Flood/Storm Information”.

The page contains links and references you can use to find up-to-the-minute information directly from local, county, and state agencies.

Links include King County Flood Services and Information (Flood Warning System), Snoqualmie River Condition/Flow (real-time), National Weather Service, Regional Public Information Network (RPIN), PSE Service Alerts, FEMA, Washington State DOT, King County Metro, and many other links to websites providing flood and storm information.

Publications posted on the Flood & Storm Information page include the *Annual Snoqualmie Flood Report*, which was recently sent citywide to all residents and businesses in the 98065 ZIP code. It has information about flood hazards specific to Snoqualmie, the Flood Warning System, flood insurance and rate discount details for residents in the floodplain, and more. The city’s snow plow routes and *Snow and Ice Plan* are also posted.

Another very useful publication posted on the city website is *the Emergency Resource Guide*, which has comprehensive information about preparing for floods, storms, earthquakes, power outages, contagious illness, and disease. It also provides guidance for protecting vulnerable populations such as children, the elderly, those with special needs, and pets.

A local emergency resource is radio station AM 1650, which is jointly owned and operated by the cities of Snoqualmie and North Bend. During times of emergency, turn to AM 1650 for announcements and time-sensitive alerts. (In times of non-emergency, recorded messages include information about tourist attractions and community activities.)
